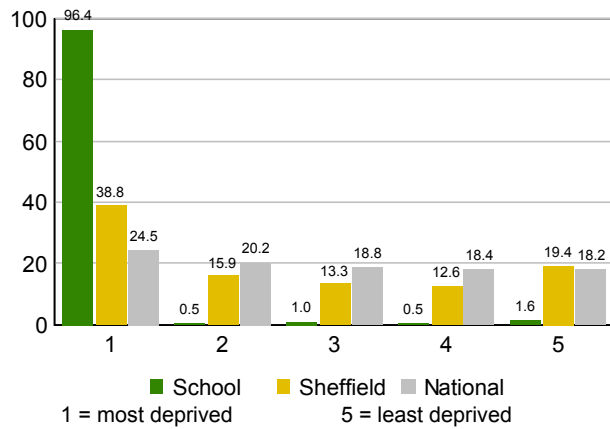

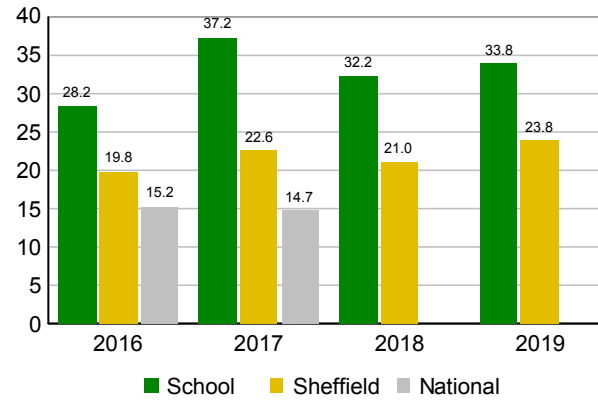

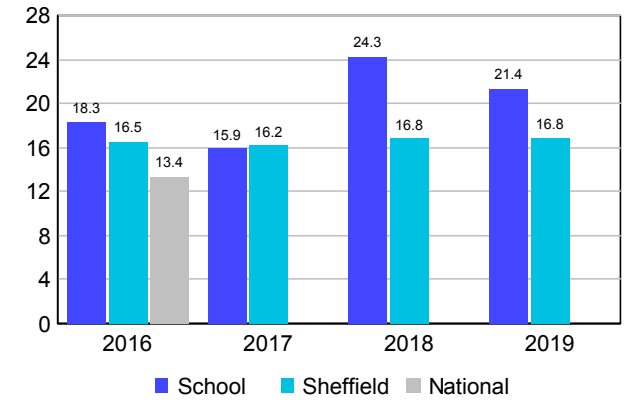
% pupils living in neighbourhoods by IDACI quintile



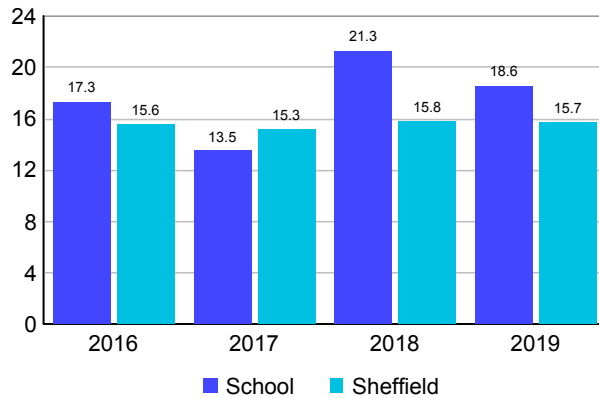
% pupils eligible for FSM



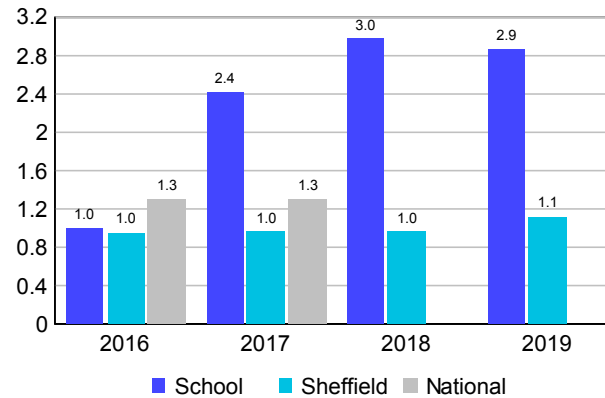
% pupils with SEN (statement / EHC plan or school support)



% pupils with SEN (without statements - see note 5)

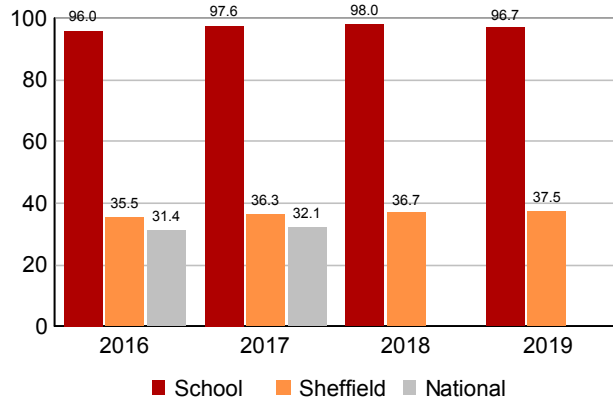


% pupils with a statement of SEN or EHC plan

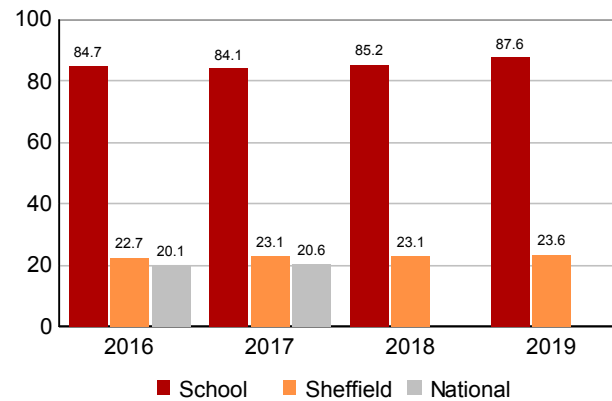

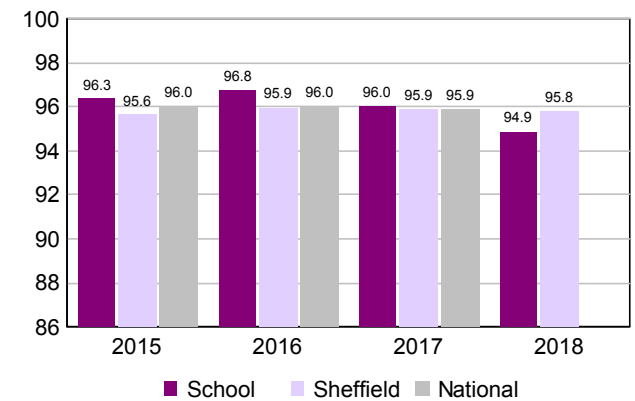
% BME pupils



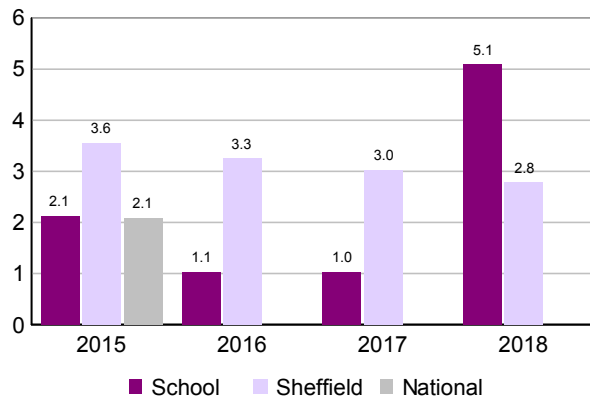
% pupils with English as an additional language



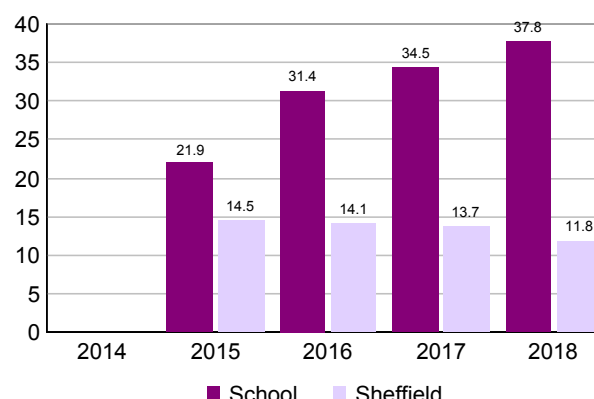
% HT 1-5 attendance

1. IDACI - Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index is a measure of the % of children in a small area living in income-deprived households. Source: 2010 English Indices of Deprivation.
2. Information on FSM, SEN and ethnicity is taken from the January School Census.
3. School and LA attendance and persistent absence data is locally calculated. Persistent absence is defined as missing 15% or more sessions.
4. Mobility data is locally calculated. A child is classed as mobile if they join or leave at a date other than the normal joining and leaving dates for that school. (For example, the transition between an infant and junior school would not be included). Further details are available from the mobility reports section within 'school comparisons'. Prior to 2010/11, only in year moves were classed as mobility and the rate in 2010/11 is not directly comparable with previous years.
5. This includes pupils recorded as school action / school action plus up to 2015. From 2015 onwards pupils recorded as 'school support' (K) are also included.
